


INTRODUCING THE HASANZ REGISTER

The HASANZ Register of Workplace Health and Safety Professionals opened for business on 27 July 2018.

It's a one-stop-shop for businesses to find reliable, quality health and safety advice and services.

This is New Zealand's first national, online register of verified workplace health and safety professionals.

Only individuals, not firms, can list on the HASANZ Register because it's the competence of the adviser that counts.

Businesses need to be able to identify qualified professionals – both consultants and in-house practitioners – with proven, relevant experience and specific skill sets to provide the right advice for better health and safety management.

The HASANZ Register has been developed by the Health and Safety Association of New Zealand (HASANZ) to meet this need, with funding from WorkSafe New Zealand and ACC. HASANZ is the umbrella organisation for New Zealand's workplace health and safety professions.

Greater use of quality-assured health and safety professionals will help reduce the risk of serious harm and fatalities in New Zealand workplaces.

Look for the **HASANZ Registered quality mark – it's like a warrant of fitness to practise as a professional in the workplace health and safety sector in New Zealand.**



So what's different about the HASANZ Register?

The HASANZ Register puts businesses at the centre of the experience – you can search for professional help for the problem you are trying to solve: asbestos, noise, policies, governance, manual handling – you name it, we've probably listed it!

People can't just pay to be on the HASANZ Register, they have to earn their place there.

Health and safety professionals on the HASANZ Register must belong to a HASANZ Full Member association and meet stringent competency standards.

HASANZ Registered professionals must provide evidence of their qualifications, experience, continuing professional development, commitment to a code of ethics, good character and required insurance cover.

Businesses can have confidence in the competence of workplace health and safety professionals listed on the HASANZ Register. And if something goes wrong, there's a recognised process for redress through the relevant HASANZ member association.

How does the HASANZ Register work?

The HASANZ Register works like a matching service between businesses and workplace health and safety professionals, providing access to a wide range of expertise.

The search function provides 3 simple ways to find the right adviser:

- A keyword search like "asbestos"
- An advanced search for professionals in one of three categories:
 - general and specialist services (e.g., health and safety audit or health monitoring)
 - a specific injury or health issue (e.g., poisoning or depression)
 - a specific health or safety subject (e.g., bullying or fatigue)
- A guided search using a series of questions.

Narrow your search by region, industry sector and business size.

The result will be a list of qualified health and safety professionals who match the search criteria. Individual high level profiles can be expanded for more detail. You can then create a shortlist.

The HASANZ Register is not a substitute for due diligence. Personal interviews and reference checks are still important steps in the selection process. See HASANZ's 5 quick questions at www.hasanz.org.nz

The number of HASANZ Registered professionals will grow steadily over the next year so businesses can access an increasingly broad range of professional services across New Zealand.
